ICFJ+ was co-founded by Code for Africa and the International Center for Journalists, with PROTO as an inaugural partner. We are registered in South Africa and operate from Cape Town, Delhi, Doha, Nairobi and Washington, DC.




ICFJ+ connects people who use information for good, to develop systemic solutions and accelerate impact.
